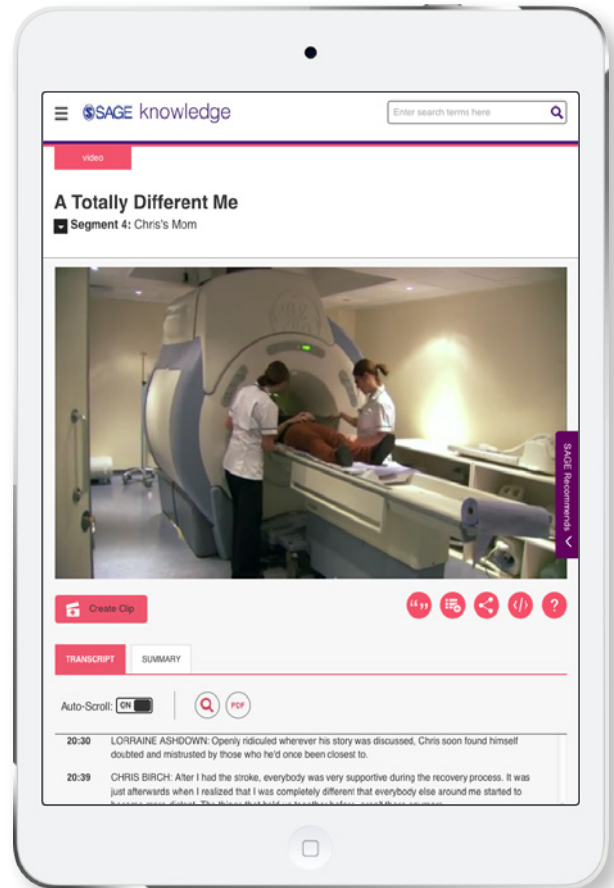

- Other professional psychologists represented, such as those in forensic psychology, sports psychology, educational psychology and clinical neuropsychology
